

JOURNAL



When was the first time you remember being aware of God's love for you? Where were you? What was happening in your life?








CRAFTING YOUR LIFE STORY

IF YOU BECAME A CHRISTIAN RECENTLY / HIGH SCHOOL OR COLLEGE:

The Four Parts of Your Life Story

1. What was my life like before I met Christ?

- What common circumstances would an unbeliever identify with?
- What were your attitudes that an unbeliever would identify with?
- What was most important to you? i.e. What substitute for God did you use to find meaning in your life? (sports, grades, relationship, partying, having fun, popularity, entertainment, etc).

2. How I realized I need Christ?

- What significant steps led up to your conversion?
- What needs, hurts, or problems made you dissatisfied with the way you were living without God?
- How did God get your attention? What motivated you?

3. How I committed my life to Christ.

- What specifically did you do?
- How did it happen? How does a person commit his life to Christ?

4. The difference it has made in my life?

- What benefits have you experienced or felt?
- What problems have been resolved?
- How has Jesus helped you change for the better?
- How has your relationship with Jesus Christ helped your relationships with others? Give a current example.

IF YOU BECAME A CHRISTIAN AS A CHILD BUT WALKED AWAY OR NEVER GREW UNTIL A DEEPER RECOMMITMENT LATER IN LIFE:

Use the same four steps, but start with the time just prior to your recommitment. Give some examples of how you were trying to meet your own needs without Christ, but it wasn't working. Describe what caused you to realize you needed Christ directly in your life and how you fully committed to Him. Then, explain how Jesus is currently meeting the deepest needs in your life.

IF YOU BECAME A CHRISTIAN AT AN EARLY AGE AND NEVER STRAYED:

Use the same four steps with this modification: focus on some deep need or common problem that others experience (see list below). Explain the difference your faith in Christ has made in your life, focusing on this specific issue. Don't say the exact age you became a Christian. Continue with steps 3 and 4.

Can you image life if you haven't found Jesus early? What has he saved you from, even if you have never lived that life.

ROUGH DRAFT OF MY LIFE STORY

Using all of your journal exercise and booklet insights, spend 10 minutes writing your testimony. You may need another sheet of paper.

SUGGESTIONS FOR PREPARING YOUR LIFE STORY

Pray and ask God to give you the right words. Write it out on paper. God honors preparation.

Keep it short and to the point. Be succinct. Avoid excessive, unnecessary details. Try to keep your testimony below 2 minutes. Goal is 1 minute.

Refer to experiences most people have in common. Share a slice of your life (as story) that they will identify with. - Spiritual Appetizer Be honest about your continuing struggles. Your life is not perfect. Don't imply that all of your problems ended at conversion.

Spend the most time on part 4 – the difference Christ has made. Emphasize WHY (the benefits) you received Christ. Mention the benefits of being certain of your destiny when you die.

Don't exaggerate or brag about pre-conversion sins.

Don't make negative remarks about other religions or people.

If you quote Scripture, limit it to one verse.

Don't mention any denomination.

Give concrete examples of the changes in your life. The more specific you are, the more dynamic your story will be. Avoid using dates, names, and ages. It doesn't matter to them.

Be prepared. Practice until it feels and sounds natural. Read it aloud and edit it to make it sound conversational. Let a friend read it and make suggestions.

Speak casually, informally, in a matter-of-fact tone. Don't dramatize or embellish your story. If you share a mystical experience, own that not everyone has these.

Don't talk down to people. Don't sound "preachy."

Use "I, me, and my" not "you." It's about you – not them.

Ask "if I had no background in Christianity, would this make sense to me?"

Choose a central theme (see list) and keep this as a focus of your story. Don't start by saying "I was raised in a Christian home ..."

Smile.

CONSIDER DELIVERY

Up until now, you have probably thought of your story in order as it hasppened. Now think about your story as a video.

As you set to record, you can tell it out of order. You can tell it as if your testimony was a movie trailer. You can tell it with a catchy opening line - have you ever clicked on an article because of "click bait?"

What would draw in listeners to your story?

It doesn't have to be linear. It does need ot be interesting.

This doesnt mean exagerating, or being overly dramatic. It means possibly looking at your story through a different lens in order to bring intrugue.

Starting off with, "I was so bad, I made my youth leader quit," is better than, "When I was young, I got in trouble a lot."

"I was inches from death, when it hit me," is a great starting line as supposed to, "Over time I started drinking too much, until one day..."

Or how is this for a hook, "I have gained and lost riches more times than I can count..."

Rework your story if you feel like you could create intrigue early on.

Remember: Being vulnerable in you tesimony is your super power! Use it!

WORKING IT OUT IN COMMUNITY
